1	Safety glasses are not needed when turning safely.	T	F

3	When using a faceplate, be certain the workpiece is solidly mounted.	T	F
4	It is useful to know terms, like lathe parts and the names of tools as you learn to turn.	T	F
5	Rotate your workpiece by hand to make sure it clears the toolrest and bed before turning the lathe "on".	T	F
6	Know your capabilities and limitations. When you are not sure of a procedure be safe when you are attempting it.	T	F
7	Remove chuck keys, adjusting wrenches and knockout bars: form a habit of checking for these items before turning on the lathe.	T	F
8	Be aware of what turners call the "red zone" or "firing zone." This is the area directly behind and in front of the workpiece.	T	F
9	Remove the tool rest before sanding, finishing or polishing operations	T	F
10	Always know the speed of the lathe before turning it on.	T	F
11	Never leave the lathe running unattended unless you return to it quickly.	T	F
12	Hold turning tools securely on the toolrest (ABC), holding the tool in a controlled but comfortable manner. Always contact the tool rest with the tool before contacting the wood.	T	F
13	Make sure the wood blank is securely fastened.	T	F
14	Tie back long hair, do not wear gloves, and avoid loose clothing, jewelry or any dangling objects that may catch on rotating parts or accessories. Do not wear open toed shoes like flip-flops.	T	F
